Literacy (reading, writing, spelling and handwriting)

Units:

- **Fiction**: Stories with familiar settings Reading and analysing extracts from classic children's fiction, then planning and writing an episode in the same style.
- To explore proverbs, sayings and figurative expressions.
- > To use extracts of classic fiction to extend use of inference and ability to use explicit and implicit information based on information at more than one point in the text.
- Non-chronological reports: Reading and analysing reports and explanations in formal and informal writing.
- To recognise key features of non-chronological report writing.
- To research before writing non-chronological texts linked to work in other subjects.
- Poetry: Poems in familiar settings Reading and discussing classic poetry and part of a Shakespeare play.
- To read and enjoy classic poetry and to develop familiarity with the poets.
- > To read and interpret poems in which the meanings are implied or multi-layered.

Alongside the units, the children will:

- Continue to learn words, apply spelling and pursue accuracy in spelling.
- Investigate spelling rules and exceptions, including developing knowledge of word roots, prefixes and suffixes.
- Secure the use of all punctuation marks in all writing and to use them to guide intonation in reading.
- Take part in the Accelerated Reading Scheme and to develop as active and articulate readers.
- To revise the grammatical and language conventions of different text types.
- Speak confidently and make effective contributions in group and class discussions.

Numeracy

Place value; addition:

• Establishing a robust understanding of place value in relation to whole numbers and decimals, which is then used in written methods and mental strategies in addition.

Algebra:

 Developing the use of trial and improvement methods, knowledge of the order of operations including brackets, and the manipulation of sentences containing unknowns.

Measures:

 Measurement in and conversion of SI and imperial units; it also covers the use of 24-hour clock and calculation of time intervals.

Subtraction:

 Mental strategies and written methods in subtracting and the appropriate use of both with whole and decimal numbers, including money.

Multiplication:

 Mental strategies and written methods in multiplying; both long and short multiplication are rehearsed, alongside a range of mental tactics.

Units:

Brainwave:

- Know about some of the recent evidence and research into the brain and learning
- Know about some of the different areas of the brain and their function
- Understand the different ways that they can learn
- Understand how they can improve their learning and their attitudes to learning
- Understand the importance of cooperation and global awareness in their learning

Express Yourself:

- Be able to gather evidence from a variety of sources
- Be able to discriminate between evidence and opinion
- Understand the importance of using evidence to test scientific ideas
- Know about the major classifications of living things
- Be able to recognise and name the major plants and animals in the host country
- Know about the structure of the human body
- Know the functions of the major internal and external parts of the human body
- Know about similarities and differences between humans and other creatures

Extreme Survivors:

- Know that changes in the environment have effects on living things
- Know about the effects of food chains in a variety of environments
- Know about ways in which the lives of people in the countries they have studied affect each other
- Be able to conduct scientific investigations posing scientific questions
- Be able to devise and use step-by-step plans
