

Dear Nursery Parents/ Guardians,

Welcome to Nursery!

We are very pleased to have your child in Nursery at Park House English School and we hope your child will settle quickly and spend a happy and progressive year with us. We look forward to working with you to build upon the work you have already completed with your child at home.

You will need to bring your child to the side gate in the EYFS department where you will be met by the Nursery staff who will escort your child to their classroom.

There will be a staggered start to settle the children, giving the children more time with adults and a smaller group of children. Your child will be split into groups A/B/C for 24th -31st August and will attend one day in the first week followed by one day in the second week in their designated group. On the 1st and 2nd of September the children will then be split into A/B groups, and they will attend on one of these days. The week commencing 5th September the children will attend classes every day. Information regarding your child's grouping will be issued closer to the start of the academic year.

Central to the school's philosophy is the belief that every child is unique with extraordinary and almost limitless potential to be discovered and nurtured. Our aim is to provide a stimulating, multicultural and international context, for your child to benefit from a well-rounded education, which encourages the highest academic standards.

We follow the Early Years Foundation Stage Curriculum and the International Early Years Curriculum at Park House English School, which offers holistic learning and development designed to address the specific needs of young children. Our staff are experienced and caring and will do everything possible to work with you, to ensure success for your child throughout the year.

Healthy children are generally happy children, so we ask you to ensure that your child comes to school, well rested and nourished, so that your child can cope with the varied programme we offer to Nursery children.

At home, please start the habit of reading and listening to stories with your child. Encourage learning by giving praise when it is deserved and maintaining a positive attitude to your child's progress. Please be aware of what is going on at school throughout the academic year and remember that the teachers are happy to discuss your child's progress.

I view the Early Years Foundation Stage as the most important phase of a child's education, for a love of learning in the first tender years, paves the way for all future success.
