Attendance

- If your child is absent phone the school office as early as possible that day and state the reason;
- **OR** send an email to secondaryadmin@parkhouseschool.com;
- Students are expected to arrive punctually at school every day;
- First 20 minutes of each day is spent with the Form Tutor (7:40am 8:00);
- Registered as late if they arrive after 7:40am;
- 'Lates' detention runs every break time for late students.





PRIDE PE Kits, Lunches, Homework

- <u>Students</u> are expected to remember their own belongings at the beginning and end of each day;
- No forgotten PE kits, lunches or homework should be delivered to the admin office or reception desk during the school day – they will not be delivered to students;
- Any lost or forgotten items left on site at the end of the day are placed in the lost property boxes around the school;
- The school accepts no responsibility for lost items of any value - it is recommended that no items of high value be brought into school at all (this includes phones, iPods, iPads, AirPods, jewellery and cash).





Organisation

Help your child to stay organised by:

• Checking their bags regularly;



- Asking them about homework and checking that they are using their homework diaries effectively;
- Getting them to pack their school bag the night before;
- Checking their pencil cases have enough equipment;
- Checking the parent portal at regular intervals.



Uniform

What this means:

- Black <u>formal</u> leather (or leather look) shoes;
- No canvas shoes, trainers or trainer-style shoes, <u>even if</u> <u>black and leather;</u>
- Boys: grey school trousers (no shorts); white shirt <u>tucked in at</u> <u>all times;</u> school jumper or fleece;
- Girls: grey school trousers or <u>knee-length</u> skirt;
- No jewellery (apart from one pair stud earrings and wrist watch);
- No hoodies (even if PHES hoodies) or non PHES sweatshirts or jumpers.

PRIDE Homework Recording

 Secondary students are expected to record their own homework and write down any test dates in their planners.



- These will not be communicated to parents as this is part of the transition process;
- Y7 students need to be responsible for their own learning and organisation;
- They will struggle with this at first!

- Our Expectations of all Students:
- Arrive to lessons on time

- Encourage your children to read;
- Show enthusiasm for reading at home;
- Ask your children about what they are reading;
- Discuss the books they have read with them;
- Accelerated Reading Programme.







PRIDE Microsoft 'Teams'

- Each student has a Microsoft 365 Account;
- **TEAMS** is a Microsoft 365 application;
- Used by **teachers** to record homework;



- Used by **students** to message the teacher, 'team' and other students;
- Teachers can upload files to the 'Team' page, e.g. supporting info or materials;
- Can be downloaded onto PC, tablets & mobile phones;
- Students and Teachers receive notifications;
- Like a 'facebook' account but for school.



Mobile Phones

- Phones should not be used (or seen) during the school day;
- Teachers will **confiscate** phones if seen;



- After school, once outside school building, phones can be used to contact drivers, parents etc.;
- Before school, during break, during lessons, phones should not be seen;
- Students should talk to one another!
- Teachers may give permission during lessons for research purposes;
- School accepts no responsibility for lost phones.





PRIDE Extra-Curricular Activities (ECAs)

 School-run ECAs (unpaid), e.g. drama club, chess club, robotics club, board games, maths puzzles club;



- Students may sign up for one unpaid ECA;
- Variety of paid ECAs available, including EVO
