

Year 2 – Park House Medium Term Curriculum Map - Term 2.1 2022-2023



ENTRY POINT

To celebrate the start of your unit, hold your own Olympics with an Olympic ceremony with Year 4 and Year 6. The children will walk around the field with their torches and Olympic rings. They can dress in team colours from their home country. Offer the children a series of competitive games that they can play in teams or individually. You may wish to have the games already set up prior to the children arriving (you may want to do this in a bigger space such as the school hall, depending on the number of activities you have chosen). Or, if time allows, you could involve the children in making and setting up the games.

While the children are enjoying and playing the games, use the opportunity to talk about what they know about the Olympics and the types of sporting activities they enjoy.
