MATHEMATICS

Multiplication and Division – 5 weeks

- recall and use multiplication and division facts for the 2, 5 and 10 multiplication tables, including recognising odd and even numbers
- calculate mathematical statements for multiplication and division within the multiplication tables and write them using the multiplication (x) division (÷) equals (=) signs
- show that multiplications of two numbers can be done in any order (commutative) and division of one number by another cannot.
- solve problems involving multiplication and division, using materials, arrays, repeated addition, mental methods, and multiplication and division facts, including problems in contexts.

Measurement – mass, capacity and temperature – 3 weeks

- choose and use appropriate standard units to estimate and measure length/height in any direction (m/cm); mass (kg/g); temperature (°C); capacity (litres/ml) to the nearest appropriate unit, using rulers, scales, thermometers and measuring vessels
- compare and order lengths, mass, volume/capacity and record the results using >, < and =

write simple fractions for example 1/2 of 6 = 3 and recognise the equivalence of 2/4 and $\frac{1}{2}$
