ENTRY POINT

MATHEMATICS

Fractions - 2 weeks

- recognise, find, name and write fractions 1/3, 1/4, 2/4 and 3/4 of a length, shape, set of objects or quantity
- write simple fractions for example 1/2 of 6 = 3 and recognise the equivalence of 2/4 and ½

Measurement - time - 2 weeks

- know the number of minutes in an hour and the number of hours in a day
- tell and write the time to five minutes, including quarter past/to the hour and draw the hands on a clock face to show these times
- compare and sequence intervals of time

Statistics – 2 weeks

- interpret and construct simple pictograms, tally charts, block diagrams and tables
- ask and answer simple questions by counting the number of objects in each category and sorting the categories by quantity
- ask and answer questions about totalling and comparing categorical data

Position and direction – 2 weeks

- order and arrange combinations of mathematical objects in patterns and sequences
- use mathematical vocabulary to describe position, direction and movement including movement in a straight line and distinguishing between rotation as a turn and in terms of right angles for quarter, half and three-quarter turns (clockwise and anti-clockwise
